PETITION FOR ACTION ON CONDITIONS OF PRETRIAL RELEASE

COMES NOW Katrina R. Jenkins, U.S. PROBATION OFFICER, presenting an official report upon the conduct of defendant Justin A. Perras, who was placed under pretrial release supervision by the Honorable Chris M. McAiley sitting in the Court at Miami, Florida on June, 26, 2006, under the following conditions:

1. Surrender all passports and travel documents, if any, to the U.S. Probation Office (Pretrial Services Unit) and not obtain any travel documents during the pendency of the case;
2. Report to the U.S. Probation Office (Pretrial Services Unit) as directed by the U.S. Probation Office (Pretrial Services Unit);
3. Submit to substance abuse testing and/or treatment as directed;
4. Refrain from excessive use of alcohol, or any use of a narcotic drug or other controlled substance, as defined in § 102 of the Controlled Substances Act, without a prescription by a licensed medical practitioner;
5. Maintain or actively seek full-time legitimate employment;
6. Maintain or begin an educational program;
7. No access to the internet via any type of connectivity device, and follow instructions as outlined in the attached agreement waiver provided to you by the U.S. Probation Office (Pretrial Services Unit);
8. May travel to and from New England and the Southern District of Florida;
9. No use or access to the internet.


Respectfully presenting petition for action of Court and for cause as follows:

In that the defendant violated the law as evidenced by the filing of a criminal complaint dated August 30, 2006 in New Bedford District Court in Massachusetts (Docket No. 06-CR-5315) charging him with Breaking and Entering Building Nighttime for Felony (2 counts) and Larceny over \$250 (2 counts); allegedly using or having access to the Internet to facilitate a fraudulent on-line credit card scheme for which federal charges may be forthcoming; and his failing to notify his supervising officer of his contact with law enforcement as required.

PRAYING THAT THE COURT WILL ORDER a warrant be issued and the defendant be brought before the court for a hearing to determine if his bond should be revoked.
