SUMMARY OF INFORMATION.-

SUBJECT: Jugoslav Activity.

A confidential informant, considered reliable, reported to this officer the following:

1. A mechanized division (unidentified) has moved into the MUGLIA-BUIL area just south of Trieste.
2. Trains carrying coal from Slovenia have been reported by source to be actually transporting clandestinely small arms which are hidden underneath the coal (Information comes from Slovenia).
3. There are noticeable military train movements in the Istrian peninsula. Trains have been noticed transporting field artillery pieces (76 m/m- Russian made) as well as mortars and small arms.
4. Military materiel (usually arms) arrive by boat (departing point not known) at SEGNA on the Jugoslav mainland.
5. The Officer in charge of these trains and boat movements is a certain Maj. PETROVICH whose headquarters are reported to be at LIKA where most of the arms are stored.
6. In Trieste, of the 1400 employees at Via Carducci (Jugoslav Headquarters) only 600 are Communist Party members.
7. In Trieste there are 20,000 organized Communists who would fight for Jugoslavia in case of any trouble. They are organized along military lines.
