MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE:

SUBJECT: AFHQ Frontier Regulations

RE: Violations of Same

1. This section has been experiencing great difficulty in trying to enforce the AFHQ travel regulations between Italy and France because of the deliberate actions on the part of the French military authorities who refuse to recognize Allied control, and who have established their own travel permit system in direct contradiction of the agreement reached between AFHQ and SHAEF in February and March of this year.

The nature of these violations is as follows:

a. The attempt to establish a new frontier inside Italian territory. b. Exercising control of the above territory and the impeding of the Allied Military Government in its operation.

c, The issuing of "laissez-passers" to Italian and French civilians for the purpose of crossing the frontier. (disregard of AMG closure of the frontier publications) The arresting of Italian war criminals in French occupied Italian territory and the transporting of same to France for trial in French tribunals.

d. Transportation of the above and other civilains in French military vehicles.

e. The transporting of displaced persons who were not properly investigated by the Allied authorities into France on French military vehicks. (this includes the persons of French nationality as well as those of nationality other than French who must pass through France in transit to regain their countres)

g. The employment of French Maquis to spread propaganda and discontent among partisan organisations in order to discrdit the Allies.

h; Demonstrations against the United States Government by violating the American flag.

i; The indiscriminate use of crossing points with utter disregard of the official AFHQ authorized crossing points.

7. (1 e) French military authorities have established their own displaced persons centers near the frontier area, with the object of relatriating not only persons of French nationality but also persons of other nationalities who wish to travel through France to regain their countries. On 13 May 1945, PEZZOTA, Alfredo, NESSI, Mario; and KUFFINI, Bartolo presented themselves to AMG, Susa and asked for passes to travel to their own home in Bergamo. Upon investigation by CIC it was found that Subjects were former laborers in DONAUCHING N, Germany and were liberated by the French and provided with transportation to PAVILLON France, issued laissez passers by Securité Militaire for trgvel to Italy and by French military vehicle Subjects were taken to Lanslebourg from where they crossed at Moncenisio into Italy. This was performed in complete disregard onthe part of French authorities of AFHQ travel regulations governing civilians.

8. (1 e) On 15 May 1945, a German military truck containing displaced persons and flying the French flag was stopped by Allied soldiers at the Turin road block. Upon investigation by CIC Agents it was found that these persons had made their way from Austria in an attempt to reach France. Further investigation revealed that of the 22 persons on the truck, 16 were French exFWs, 3 soldiers in civilian clothing who had been promised refuge in France, 2 were Belgians and 1 a citizen of Luxemburg. A similar contained several Frenchmen as well as 4 Dutchmen. Although an Allied displaced persons penter exists in Moncalieri, Tarin, the French insist on handling their own dis laced persons centers. 1 9. (1e) In a discussion with Capt. Van Laethem, French liaison officer the CIC Agents protested against the assumption by the French of an AFHQ function solely under the control of Maj. Stewart appointed by AFHQ. Capt. Van Laethem insisted that French authorities would handle French repatriates.

16. (lg) It has also been ascertained by CIC Agents that members of the French Maquis posing as Italian partisans are spreading propaganda and discontent among the civilian popluation discrediting the Allies; These persons have entered Italy illegally and it has been reported that they are actually French soldiers in the pay of the French Army.

11. (1h) Reports have been received at this office that circulars demandiing annexation of Northwestern Italy by France are being circulated by the French Maquis who are operating with the Italian Paritsans along the Fronti ier region from Ventimiglia on the Riviera to the Swiss border north of Aosta; Newspaper articles, amanating from partisan groups in Cuneo,

Turin, and Ventimiglia, demand immediate annexation of Piedmont by With the French Maquis are "tal ian Communists who, tothe French. gether, are storing arms and munitions in the Alpine redouts with the express purpose of harassing American and Dritish liberation troops. It was also noted that French Maquis intelligence agenty known are cooperating with the Partisans intelligence known as S.A.P. in several regions near Cuneo, Ventimiglia and Pas du Paradis. In Cuneo, anti-Allied manifests have been posted on buildings in that area and propaganda leaflets are being distributed. Petitions are being signed by thousands of persons signifying this their intentions to detach this area from Italy and become part of France. Partisan leaders of the S.A.P., Turin, have made statements that they don't want the Allies in northwestern Italy and they will de driven out as the Germans were. In Truin, a meeting was held by the G.L. (Giustizia Liberta) on 22May 1945 in which speakers expressed their desire to become annexed to France and that all effort should be made to drive the Allies from Northern -taly.

12. (1h) On two separate occassions, once at CESANA and the other at CHIEMONTE, the American flag has been torn from its mast from an Allied occupied building. The intent obviously was to discredit the Allied control of the area which in effect subtracts from Allied prestige in the region and indirectly weakens the position of the Frontier Control Detachment in their efforts to control movement of persons in the frontier region and across the frontier.

13. (1i) It has been ascertained by agents of this section that the French are still violating regulations governing official crossing points. Besides the official crossing points of Mount Genavre and Ventimiglia, the French are using several other unofficial and illegal crossing some of which are the Little St. Bernard Pass, Moncenisio, Maddalena Pass, San Belmazzo, Breglio and Larché. Over these passes French military vehicles transport both military personnel and zivlians: These section has founded it impossible to exercise complete control under the existing circumstances;.
