Headquarters to Royal Yugoslav Organization in
Switzerland.

TO : OSI (b), 2 District

1. The attached telegrams (translations of originals) originated from Draja MIHAILOVIC's secret headquarters in Yugoslavia and were destined for members of the Royalist resistance movement in Italy and Switzerland.

2. Source is usually reliable, although telegrams are definitely one-sided.

3. Information contained therein is being passed on without comments and for your information.

I. Specific

In answer to your telegram we communicate:

- A. 1. Opposition in Yugoslavia is formed by 80% of the population. This opposition decreases daily due to the terror and the massacre of entire anti-Tito families. Another cause in the decrease in opposition is the intense propaganda directed at the younger people.
2. Political opposition groups work in small numbers and are assisted by a clandestine press. They seek to unite but are unable due to the terrorist campaign by the communists.
3. The opposition of Dr. Milan GROL, ex-president during the Tito-Serbian regime, is not recognized. The Serb population is politically united due to the activity of Ravana GORA. Liaison between Dr. MACEK's Croatian Farmers Party and the Slovene Peoples SIS Party has been established.
- B. 1. Dragoljub JOVANOVIC is the puppet in the hands of the communists. The population bases its hopes on the activities of Slobodan JOVANOVIC, Milan GAVRILOVIC, MACEK and KREK. POTICH, the ambassador from Washington is well liked.
2. Our troops are located thirkybthroughout the territory. They move about in small groups in order to avoid detection by the communists who are well equipped and aided by the URSS.
3. Liaison between our groups functions excellently. The number of troops mobilized and hidden in the woods and hills is around 100,000. This number includes all resistance forces. In the case of a rebellion, 300,000 to 400,000 can be counted upon to assist morally, politically and materially.
4. Our forces move about continually and never occupy a position for an indefinite period. They are not equipped to do so for they lack the necessary arms. They have pistols, rifles, and a few sub-machine guns, but no artillery.
5. If pursued, our troops can find refuge in any of the following regions: KOPAONIK, JASTREBAC, HOMOLJE, DRAGACEVO, SKOPSKA, CRNAGORA, BABUNA, MAJEVICA, ROMANIJA, GRMEC, DINARA, PAPUK, POORAVSKA, SLATINA. Our forces lean to these regions for support and refuge.

II. General:

1. No form of resistance can be attempted without the following assistances:
Arms from foreign countries and a strong propaganda movement in our favor. The least indication of active resistance will result in the annihilation of the Serb nation.
2. "Tito" has at his disposition 40 Infantry divisions, an armored division, 8 KNOJ corps, and 2 aviation wings. In all about 500,000 to 700,000 men. These divisions consist beside Yugoslavs; Bulgarians, Albanians, Russians, Italian communists and Greeks. They have modern arms of Allied, Russian and German manufacture, plus a huge supply of ammunition. Their aircraft are of English and Russian origin. All officers and non-commissioned officers are schooled by Russians. The Navy is made up of the now unseaworthy, ex-Royal Yugoslav Navy. Infiltration into the "Tito" government or OZNA is nearly impossible. We know because we have tried and failed.
3. Union between Yugoslavia and Bulgaria is not approved by the Russians. The Yugoslavian government receives its orders from the Russians. The heads of city governments have no relations with the citizens, as they serve only to mask the Russian-Communist rule.
4. The Russians exert their influence in all walks of life. This is especially true in the armed forces. The War Cabinet in "Tito's" government is modeled after the Russians and is dominated by Red Army officers. Of Tito's officers, 10% are Russian. They are either in uniform or civilian clothes. They keep the army, industry, and commerce under constant surveillance.
5. In conclusion, the OZNA is the GPU. OZNA agents attend school in Russia. OZNA schools are also located in Yugoslavia.
6. Repeat as in telegrams 52 and 53, the elections were corrupt.
7. To date, politicians and military have received most benefit through UNRRA supplies. Most people have yet to receive any assistance. Russians divisions have withdrawn from Yugoslavia. Only small garrisons remain. There are small garrisons at VOJVODINA and SKOPLJE. Anti-aircraft emplacements are numerous in Belgrade.
8. Russian experts (naval officers) together with "Tito's" naval officers are on the Adriatic coast.
9. All of our forces scattered throughout the country should be united, and after the military and propaganda preparations have been completed by the Allies, we, under our tri-color, can liberate our nation. This should be done immediately, and I repeat it in every report, before

the communists with their terror and propaganda machines destroy our forces which are scattered, and which are not protected by the Allies.

For ILIJEV

1. Communicate to the Allies that the terror inflicted upon the people by TITO's followers surpasses anything imaginable. Any honest citizen believed to be a nationalist is regarded a dangerous person by the communists and is liquidated.
2. The country is badly equipped to fight "TITO". Any rebellion will lead to the complete annihilation of the rebels. The people look forward to Allied help since injustice is now reigning over justice and force over liberty. These are all against Allied doctrines.
3. For nearly a year now, our people have been forgotten by the Allies and find themselves at the mercy of "TITO"s men. During this period, "TITO" has been planting communism firmly in the country. The people can only hope for salvation from the Allies. Our dead during this period numbers nearly as many as were suffered during the Nazi occupation.
4. Make known to the Allies that the intentions of the communists know no limits. After all our sufferings, the Allies' desire of peace is only a dream.
5. The misery of our people during this winter has hit a new high. Meanwhile, the communists have everything. People die of hunger in Montenegro, LIKA, HERZEGOVINA, and DALMATIA. During these times the eyes of our people are turned towards the United States and England. We are entitled to help. The Allies have had the opportunity to see that "TITO" is a terrorist and destroyer. The Yugoslavs did not fight the Germans for this end.
