MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE:

SUBJECT: Frontier Guard System

RE: Re-establishment of Strict Control in the Vicinity of Souk el Arba

This Agent has noted that since 16 July 1944, French security authorities have re-established the security measures taken upon closing the frontier. All of the road-blocks removed with the re-opening of the frontier (See memo dated 9 July 1944, Same Subject) have been replaced and even re-enforced.

Another improvement in frontier security is the establishing of a permanent police post at Soulay bou Selhem (as suggested by this Agent- see memo, dated 9 July 1944, Same Subject) to check all tourists for proper authorizations, and to keep suspicious individuals under constant surveillance.

AGENT'S NOTES:

This agent is of the opinion that the above measures have been taken due to the expected enemy parachute landings and also the expected attempt to cross by General GIRAUD. (See memo dated 17 July 1944, same subjects).
